



SPECIAL Trevor Wingrove Bursary Application Form - Instructions

Thank you for considering the Coquitlam Foundation scholarship and bursary program for help in furthering your education. The Coquitlam Foundation annually distributes scholarships bursaries, primarily to graduating high school students who are in need of financial support to continue their education. Adult learners are also welcome to apply.

While there are four bursaries and scholarships to choose from and you may submit a separate application for each, **only one will be awarded per student.** However, students may continue to apply each year of their studies if they have not yet been granted an award.

Note: Bursaries must be claimed within three years or be forfeited. The application of this time limit is subject to the Foundation's consideration of any extenuating circumstances that may prevent the recipient's claim within the time period.

Deadline: The deadline for submissions is 4 pm, April 5, 2019.

How to Submit an Application

Your application must be emailed to the Coquitlam Foundation at <u>info@coquitlamfoundation.com</u> with this fillable PDF form. Submit your entire application and information **in no** more than 3 pdf files attached to your email. Use the words "2019 APPLICATION" in the subject line of your email. Applications that are submitted in any other file formats will not be accepted. You can expect to receive an email response within 3 business days acknowledging our receipt of your application.

IMPORTANT NOTE: The Coquitlam Foundation reserves the right to disqualify any applications that are incomplete, late in being submitted, illegible and/or do not otherwise follow the submission guidelines.

Review Process

Applications are reviewed by a volunteer citizen-based committee appointed by the Coquitlam Foundation. Final decisions are ratified by the volunteer Board of Directors of the Coquitlam Foundation. Successful applicants will be notified in May, 2019 and will be invited to attend the Coquitlam Foundation Awards Celebration Evening at the Evergreen Cultural Centre on June 20, 2019 to accept their award.

The information that you provide in your application is required for assessment purposes only and is kept confidential by the Coquitlam Foundation and those involved in the assessment process.

Bursary and Scholarship Options

Select one of the following four bursaries and scholarships to apply for

1. James Gordon Stewart Fund Scholarship Select

In May of 2012, as directed by a very generous testamentary gift made by long-time Coquitlam resident James Gordon Stewart, the Coquitlam Foundation established the James Gordon Stewart Fund Scholarship. The scholarship is given annually to a deserving student(s) residing in the Tri-Cities Coquitlam and attending Simon Fraser University.

Eligibility

To be eligible for this scholarship the applicant must:

- 1. be a resident of Coquitlam, Port Coquitlam or Port Moody
- 2. attend Simon Fraser University
- 3. demonstrate financial need
- 4. have a history of school and community involvement
- 5. demonstrate academic success sufficient to enter post-secondary
- 6. begin designated studies within eight months of formal notification of selection, and
- 7. submit a written report upon completion of the applicable term of studies

2. Raymond A. LeClair Memorial Scholarship Select

In 1983, the LeClair family established a scholarship program in memory of Raymond A. LeClair, Manager of the Municipality of Coquitlam from 1967 to 1982. The scholarship is given annually to a deserving individual planning to pursue a career in the public service with priority given to those who pursue a career in public administration.

Eligibility

To be eligible, the applicant must:

- 1. be a resident of the City of Coquitlam
- 2. demonstrate financial need
- 3. have a history of school and community involvement
- 4. demonstrate academic success sufficient to enter post-secondary
- 5. begin designated studies within eight months of formal notification of selection, and
- 6. submit a written report upon completion of the applicable term of studies

3. Coquitlam Foundation Bursary Select

The Coquitlam Foundation is proud of its 25 year history of encouraging and supporting a vibrant, sustainable, and healthy community. Our vision for the City of Coquitlam is a community where quality of life is enhanced by residents and organizations creating lasting legacies (building endowment funds) that support bursaries, scholarships and community grants.

Eligibility

To be eligible, the applicant must:

- 1. be a resident of the City of Coquitlam (unless otherwise specified by a particular fund)
- 2. demonstrate financial need
- 3. have a history of school and community involvement
- 4. demonstrate academic success sufficient to enter post-secondary
- 5. begin designated studies within eight months of formal notification of selection (unless later commencement is approved by the Foundation)
- 6. submit a written report upon completion of the applicable term of studies

4. Trevor Wingrove Fund Bursary Select

The Trevor Wingrove Bursary Fund was established in 2013 in the memory of Trevor Wingrove, a long-time local lacrosse star and respected City of Coquitlam manager who died of cancer at the age of 42 in 2010. Bursaries are to be awarded for post-secondary education or training to a student-athlete who has played lacrosse with the Coquitlam Minor Lacrosse Association for at least two years. Winners must graduate from high school, have a good academic record, and exemplify some of the qualities that made Trevor Wingrove an inspiration on and off the lacrosse-box floor, including: leadership; performance; dedication, commitment and perseverance; and sportsmanship (respect for teammates, opponents, officials and self).

Eligibility

To be eligible, the applicant must:

- 1. demonstrate financial need
- 2. have a history of school and community involvement
- 3. demonstrate academic success sufficient to enter post-secondary education
- 4. have played lacrosse with the Coquitlam Minor Lacrosse Association for at least two years
- 5. exemplify the qualities of leadership, performance, dedication, commitment and perseverance
- 6. begin studies at a recognized post-secondary institution within eight months of formal notification of selection (unless later commencement is approved by the Coquitlam Foundation)
- 7. submit a written report upon completion of the applicable term of studies
